ANGLICAN CHURCH IN NORTH AMERICA

ASSEMBLY



250-300 Members



Representation proportional to diocesan size with additional youth delegates



Ratifies changes to the Constitution and Canons



Meets at least every 5 years

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE



12 elected members (half clergy & half laity)



Prepares budget and oversees the administration of the church in between Provincial Council meetings



Meets monthly by conference call, and triannually in person (FEB, JUN, and AUG)

PROVINCIAL COUNCIL



110-130 Members



4 representatives per diocese (half clergy & half laity)



Approves the budget, elects members to the Executive Committee, recommends to the Assembly changes to the Constitution and Canons

COLLEGE OF BISHOPS



40-60 members



Oversees and guards the worship and doctrine of the church



Meets biannually (JAN and JUN)



A congregation elects members to their Diocesan Synod



Each Diocese elects members to Provincial Council and Assembly



A Diocese elects a new bishop and the College of Bishops must consent to the elected candidate.



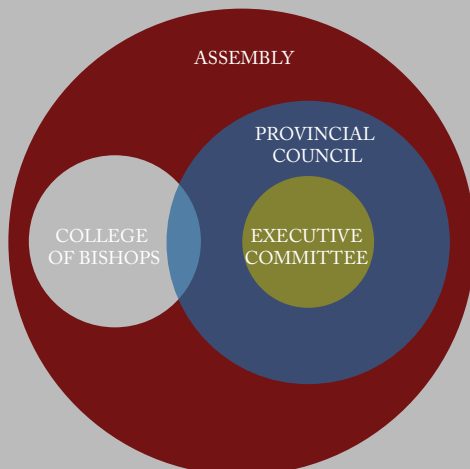
Provincial Council is made up of four members from each Diocese.



Assembly is made up of members from each Diocese, proportionate to diocesan size.



Executive Committee is elected by Provincial Council



College of Bishops - All active bishops are part of the Assembly. All Diocesan bishops are members of Provincial Council & may be elected to Executive Committee.

Executive Committee - Members are part of Assembly and Provincial Council.

Provincial Council - Most members are part of Assembly
